

# PRESENTATION OF THE CONFERENCE

Côte d'Ivoire hosts, on September 15 and 16, 2025, the 16th AIST Symposium, around the theme: "What future for the Treasury's business processes in this era of digitalization?"

This conference will be held in Abidjan, the economic capital of Côte d'Ivoire. Participants from the twenty-nine (29) member countries will take part in these meetings at the Sofitel Abidjan Hotel Ivoire.

#### YOUR TRIP

#### 1. Visa formalities

# The visa-exempt nationalities

Are exempt from visa, the nationals of the following countries:

Benin, Burkina Faso, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Republic of the Congo, Gambia, Ghana, Republic of Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Liberia, Mali, Mauritania, Morocco, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Togo, Tunisia, Djibouti.

Apart from these, any other participant must be in possession of a passport and a biometric visa *to be obtained on the dedicated website* (snedai.com/e-visa or www.snedai.com) or from diplomatic missions.

The period of validity of the passport required to obtain a visa is at least six (6) months before its expiration date.

# The online e-visa procedure

Payment for the *e-visa is made on the dedicated website* snedai.com/e-visa or www.snedai.com. The visa application must be made 48 hours (2 business days) before the departure date. However, we recommend that you formulate it 5 working days in advance to take into account unforeseen circumstances. For any



assistance regarding the visa application, we kindly ask you to write to us at the following email addresses: mcefp@tresor.gouv.ci or daniellegnanago@tresor.gouv.ci

The documents to be attached to the application are:

- the copy of the valid passport (at least 6 months);
- the copy of the plane ticket (round trip) if available eventually;
- the copy of the international vaccination booklet page with up-todate vaccines (notably the yellow fever vaccine);
- the invitation letter from the AIST.

# The classic visa procedure in an Embassy

# List of documents to be presented at Abidjan Airport

- Documents common to all participants
  - the passport valid for a minimum of 6 months;
  - the international certificate of vaccination against yellow fever.
- Documents specific to e-visa holders
  - the original of the registration receipt for the visa fee;
  - the approved pre-enrolment document (favorable response from evisa validation services of the Directorate of Territorial Surveillance (DST)).



#### 2. Customs formalities

In order to facilitate customs formalities, participants are invited to affix the AIST logo on their luggage and bring the boarding pass.

For health-related concerns, the country has an extensive network of public and private health centres and hospital facilities with a technical platform meeting international standards and norms.

### 3. Climate and temperature

The symposium is held in Abidjan, the economic capital located in the south of the country. This part of the country is characterized by low temperatures, high humidity and abundant rainfall. It experiences four seasons. In September, in Abidjan, the average temperature is about 25°c.

# 4. Sanitary requirements for entry into Cote d'Ivoire

#### 4.1 Preventive measures

International travelers must take all preventive measures against infectious diseases and make the appropriate vaccines (yellow fever, meningitis, cholera, typhoid, tetanus...)

# 4.2 The yellow fever vaccine

It is mandatory for travelers entering Cote d'Ivoire.

A check of the valid vaccination certificate will be carried out upon arrival in Côte d'Ivoire.

It is highly recommended to get a yellow fever vaccination in your country of origin, at least 10 days before travel. Failing this, the vaccine will be administered to you at Abidjan Airport upon your arrival by a team from the National Institute of Public Hygiene (the cost of the vaccine is 7000 CFA francs or  $\epsilon$ 10.67).

# 4.3 Control of haemorrhagic fever

Travelers with a hemorrhagic fever will be supported by the services of the National Institute of Public Hygiene (INHP) until the end of the fever tests.

#### 4.4 Travel insurance

It is strongly recommended to take out travel insurance.

# 5. Prevention against Malaria

It is advisable for any traveler coming from areas where malaria does not occur to consult a doctor in order to benefit from preventive treatment against malaria.

# 2. Public Treasury, 62 years at the service of development in Côte d'Ivoire

The Ivorian Public Treasury has contributed a lot to financing the country's development. During the first two (2) decades of independence (1960-1979), it contributed significantly to the financing of economic and social development plans. The financial crisis of the two (02) following decades (1981-2000) led him to participate in the management of structural adjustment programs.

During the decade of political and institutional crisis from 2002 to 2011, the Public Treasury demonstrated resilience by ensuring the financing of essential state spending.

Since the end of the crisis, the Public Treasury has participated in the preparation and implementation of National Development Plans (NDPs) from 2012 to 2015, from 2016 to 2020, and from 2021 to 2025.



# AKWABA, WELCOME TO COTE D'IVOIRE, LAND OF HOSPITALITY

#### 1. General Presentation of Côte d'Ivoire

Côte d'Ivoire is a country in West Africa with an area of 322,463 km2. It has these boundaries: to the north Burkina Faso and Mali, to the south the Atlantic Ocean (Gulf of Guinea), to the east Ghana, and to the west Guinea and Liberia. The country has a hot and humid climate.

It positions itself as the hub of West Africa. Indeed, with sustained growth for years, Côte d'Ivoire is the second largest economy in the



Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), after Nigeria. Within the West African Economic and Monetary Union (WAEMU), the country alone contributes 40% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of the Union.

Its political and administrative capital is Yamoussoukro. Abidjan, the large metropolis in the south of the country, is naturally the economic capital. In addition to these two cities, the other major cities of Côte d'Ivoire are Bouaké, San-Pédro, Daloa, Korhogo and Bondoukou.

The first President of Ivory Coast is Félix HOUPHOUËT-BOIGNY. The current President is HEM Alassane OUATTARA. The population is estimated in 2024 at 32,711,500 inhabitants. (1)



This country, navigating between tradition and modernity, will make you experience the pleasures of urbanity as well as a total change of scenery. Côte d'Ivoire is a generous land, between sea, river, lagoon and riverside. A paradise where the forest and the savannah are protected, with National Parks (8 in number, namely the Banco National Park, the Comoé National Park, the Marahoué National Park, the Taï National Park...) classified as UNESCO world heritage.

The country has four (4) major rivers which are the Cavally, the Sassandra, the Bandama and the Comoé.

Moreover, Côte d'Ivoire has a rich and varied gastronomy, with nice dishes such as attiéké, alloco, kédjenou, foutou...

#### 2. Economic overview of Côte d'Ivoire

A brief economic and financial situation of Côte d'Ivoire over the last three (3) years can be read in five tables.

**Real sector:** despite its vulnerability to external shocks, the Ivorian economy has resilience characteristics. The average growth rate is over 6% in real terms, driven mainly by investment in infrastructure on the demand side and by investment in supply from the extractive industry, transport and telecommunications. To this is added the contribution of the agricultural sector where the country is the world's leading exporter of cocoa and cashew, and the leading African exporter of coffee.

**Public finances:** while public resources (tax revenues, non-tax revenues and donations) are steadily increasing, government spending is growing faster in connection with index advancements and staff recruitment (education and health) as well as a proactive investment policy, particularly in infrastructure. This results in a budget deficit of more than 3%. Public debt, which is below 55% of GDP, presents a moderate risk because it is far from the Community ceiling of 70%.



**Monetary situation:** the restrictive monetary policy within WAEMU is reflected in the continued tightening of bank credit and the monitoring of prudential ratios. Thus, the increase in the money supply takes place within the limits of inflation control which, although it is above the 3% Community ceiling, is still below the average for emerging countries (8%).

**External accounts:** although the trade balance is structurally in surplus, the current account balance shows a deficit of 8% of GDP due to the deterioration in the services balance. The capital and financial account downturns result in an overall balance of payments of 3% of GDP.

2025 outlook: the 2025 outlook is even more optimistic, in line with the more favorable evolution of the international environment and internal macroeconomic stability. The forecasts are as follows: economic growth rate (6.3%), budget deficit (3%), debt under control (55%), increase in the money supply within the limits of controlling inflation which must fall below 3% and projection of the surplus balance of the balance of payments of 2.4% of GDP.

# YAMOUSSOUKRO: THE BASILICA OUR LADY OF PEACE


Visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in Yamoussoukro and discover its history during a guided tour. With a private guide, explore the grounds of the Basilica while admiring the architecture and statues of one of the largest churches in the world. Your visit also offers a view of the presidential palace, the Félix Houphouët-Boigny Foundation for Peace and the crocodiles lake.



# ABIDJAN: THE MOHAMMED VI MOSQUE OF DJIBOUTI city

Located in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire, the MOHAMED VI mosque is an architectural masterpiece donated by the King of Morocco. Inaugurated in April 2024, it can accommodate approximately 7,000 persons. Built in a traditional Moroccan style, it includes prayer rooms, a Koranic school, a library, a conference room and green spaces.

A strong symbol of Moroccan-Ivorian cooperation, this mosque is a place of spirituality, religious formation and the promotion of values of peace and tolerance.



# ABIDJAN: THE CATHEDRAL OF SAINT PAUL DU PLATEAU

This large religious building built in 1985 was blessed by Pope John Paul II. Architectural work of great dimension, its beautiful cross always holds out its hands to the Ivorian capital on the lagoon side. The cathedral receives daily visits from Christians from here and elsewhere in pilgrimage.



#### KONG: THE MOSQUES OF KONG


Listed as a UNESCO cultural heritage sites, due to their very good conservation and their historical, cultural and spiritual values, the 2 centuries-old mosques of Kong, in Sudanese style, are must-see tourist sites to visit in the Savannah District.





#### YAMOUSSOUKRO: THE FÉLIX HOUPHOUËT- BOIGNY FOUNDATION FOR THE SEARCH FOR PEACE

Created in 1973 under the name of Fondation Félix Houphouët-Boigny, it became in 1997 the Fondation Félix Houphouët-Boigny pour la Recherche de la Paix. It is the source of the International Congress on Peace in the minds of men in 1989 and the Yamoussoukro Declaration for Peace in 1997, both placed and organized under the auspices of UNESCO.



# ABIDJAN: THE MUSEUM OF CIVILIZATIONS OF IVORY COAST

This museum is located in Abidjan, more precisely in the town of Plateau, in the corner formed by Boulevard Nangui Abrogoua and Avenue Carde. The Museum of Civilizations of Côte d'Ivoire was originally a craft center created by the colonial administration. It is with the aim of highlighting artisanal productions and preserving the best samples that Hubert Deschamps, then Governor, created this center in 1942.



# ABIDJAN: THE CRAFT CENTER OF THE CITY OF ABIDJAN

You will find in this center batiks, Korhogo paintings, loincloths, jewelry and paintings. These pieces come from Ghana, Mali or Nigeria. Each seller has their speciality. You will be able to observe some craftmen at work.



# GRAND- BASSAM: THE VILLAGE ARTISANAL OF GRAND- BASSAM

Spread along both sides of the city's entrance road from Abidjan by the old road, in the vicinity of the Rosier district, the artisanal village of Grand-Bassam welcomes the newcomer and welcomes him in its own way. From rattan armchairs to the most unusual art objects, including traditional outfits from here and elsewhere, we find everything there.







#### ASSINIE: THE ANIABA MUSEUM

Located in the village of Mafia, the "ANIABA" museum in Assinie is a pilgrimage site for those who want to immerse themselves in the rich cultural heritage of the N'ZIMA. There are many relics of the past, as well as costumes, ornaments, traditional objects, as well as a guide who will have you discover the history of this peninsula.



# ABIDJAN: THE NATIONAL PARK OF BANCO

Transformed into a National Park since 1953, the Banco is a forest massif of 3,474 hectares. It is the very first National Park in Côte d'Ivoire. It is, in the world, the second park after the Tijuca National Park of Rio de Janeiro in Brazil. It supplies the city of Abidjan with drinking water and is the green lung of this city. It is a dense forest with trails where the leaves intertwine to give the impression of a tunnel. An incursion into this place will allow you to discover its wonders and its hidden side.



#### BEACH: THE BEACH OF THE BEACH

Flagship of the Ivorian tourism industry, Assinie, a locality located about 80 km from Abidjan, in the region of South-Comoé, in the southeast of the country, is one of the must-see places to visit on Eburnean land. The wonderful spectacle of its sunny banks, straddling the lagoon and the ocean, is a real call to discovery, relaxation and idleness.



#### YAMOUSSOUKRO: THE LAKES TO THE CROCODILES

The crocodiles of Yamoussoukro populate the lakes surrounding the Presidential Palace. They are Nile crocodiles. These beasts can weigh up to one ton each and can measure up to six meters long. They can make jumps of several meters to seize the food that is given to them daily. The lake and its crocodiles are a renowned tourist attraction throughout West Africa.





#### SAN-PÉDRO: GRAND-BÉRÉBY AND HIS NATURAL POOLS

Grand-Bereby is a jewel of nature. We have the presence of enormous granite blocks shaped by erosion on the extent of the beaches. These blocks, at low tide, offer us natural pools with crystalline waters, the most famous of which is in Tabaoulé, a tourist site of Grand-Bereby, a must-see if you are in the region of Bas-Sassandra.




#### MAN: MAN'S STUNTS

The city of Man is a tourist hotspot in Cote d'Ivoire, thanks to its many tourist attractions including the famous natural waterfalls.



#### MAN: MOUNT NIMBA

It is an emblematic mountain of West Africa, combining spectacular mountain panoramas, unique ecological wealth and a vital water reservoir. Its high endemism in fauna and flora makes it an invaluable site. However, it remains weakened by human activities. The integral reserve, the result of protection since 1944, remains a strong symbol of transboundary conservation, but requires constant support to preserve its integrity.



#### MAN: THE "dent de Man"

The Dent de Man is a mountain located in the city of Man, in the Tonkpi region, in the north-west of Côte d'Ivoire. It consists of a set of twin rocks 900 meters high and they overlook the city.





#### MAN: THE "PONT DE LIANE"

The most famous of these bridges is located in Lieupleu, about 80 km from Man. It crosses the Cavally River, but there are about ten in the surroundings. Made of dried vines, they are said to have been built in one night according to local beliefs.



#### KOSSOU: THE KOSSOU DAM

The Kossou dam is a major hydroelectric power plant located on the Bandama River, near the city of Kossou, in the center of the country. Built between 1969 and 1972, it was the first large dam in Ivory Coast.

It created the lake of Kossou, the largest artificial lake in the country, covering more than 1,600 km 2. The dam is mainly used to produce electricity (hydroelectric power plant), regulate the waters of the river, and promote agriculture and fishing.



# 4.2 Some popular masks






The Zaouli (or Zahouli), also called "Djela Lou Zaouli" ("Zaouli, Djela's daughter") refers to both a mask, a costume and a traditional dance profane of the Gouro people of Ivory Coast.


This dance is now adopted by a large number of other ethnic groups close to the Gouro people. This dance is the link between all the dances of the country based primarily on the dexterity and agility of the dancer.

#### THE ZAHOULI THE GOLI

The Goli mask is part of the cultural and spiritual heritage of the Wan people. Historically, the first to inhabit the region of Gbêkê (Bouakê), they practiced a dance whose symbol is none other than the Goli mask[. According to the Wan, the Goli would imitate the dragon when he dances.








#### THE BOLOYE

The Boloye is a sacred dance of the Senufo, an ethnic group from northern Cote d'Ivoire. It is also called the "dance of the leopard-men" because the clothes worn by the dancer imitate the fur of these felines. This dance is performed to close the initiation rites.

#### THE WAMBÊLÊ

The Wambêlê is one of the great masks of the Senufo people. It is commonly referred to as 'wanioug'. It is a special and mysterious mask, composed of two opposite sides (double-sided) causing smoke to come out. The Wambêlê is also a protective mask.







#### THE COMING OUT OF THE TCHOLOGO

This outing refers to the end of the initiation period for the Poro rite among the Senufo, more precisely among the Niarafolo of Ferkessédougou, in Cote d'Ivoire. This ritual marks the return of initiates (the "Cheeles") to society after a period of isolation in the sacred forest. The release of the Tchologo is an important event, often accompanied by festivities and celebrations, and is an opportunity to talk about local development.

#### THE GLA

The sacred mask of the Guéré, the people of the mountainous west, Gla Williamba or Gnonkpo Gla, is the ancestor mask of the ethnic group, the one that gave birth to all the others. Of an imposing shape, he has protuberant eyes, an overloaded frame of glass bell and metal objects.


